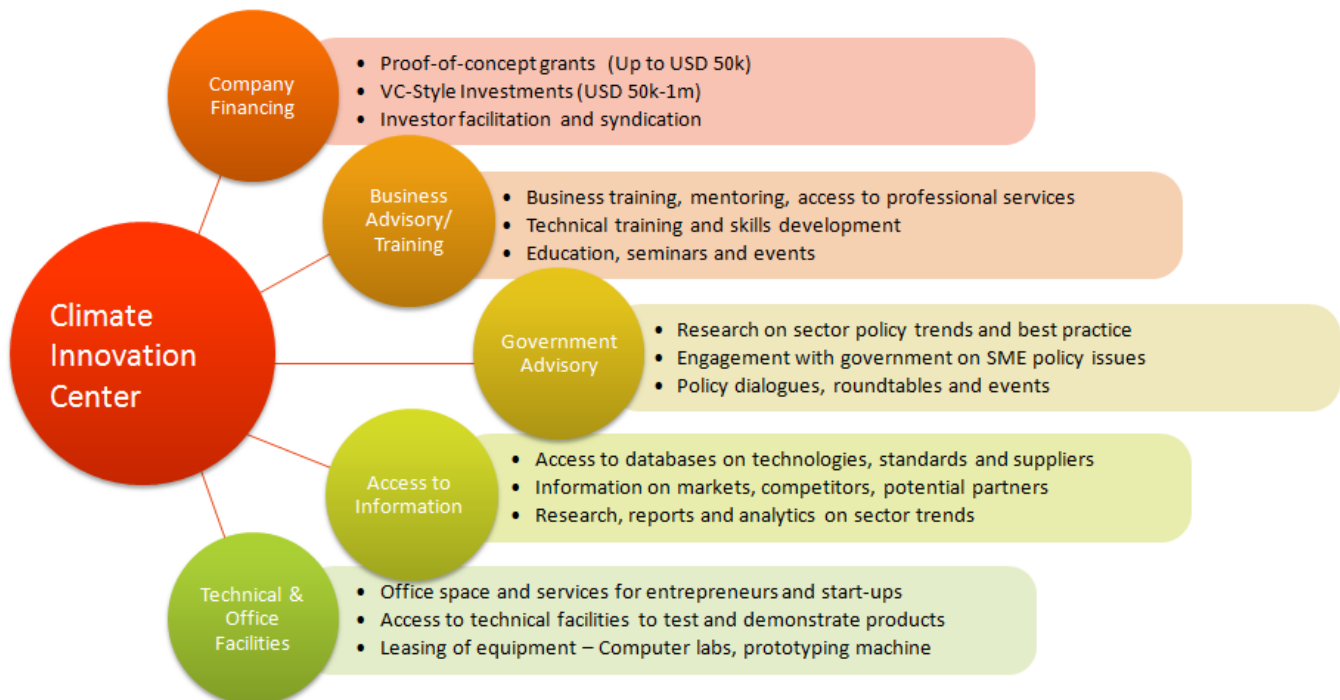
## Supporting Green Jobs for a Green Economy

The Innovation Hub Management Company (Pty) Ltd (TIHMC), a subsidiary of Blue IQ Investment Holdings (Pty) Ltd, on behalf of the Gauteng Provincial Government's Department of Economic Development (DED) is working with *infoDev*, a public-private partnership in the World Bank Group, to develop a Climate Innovation Centre (CIC) for Gauteng. The CIC will provide financing and other services to help South Africa pro-actively – and profitably – develop, transfer and deploy advanced climate-smart technologies that meet local needs.

The CIC will help achieve the Gauteng province's and the country's "New Growth Path" objectives of job creation, industrial development and improved environmental performance and shift to a "Green Economy" in line with Gauteng Province's Green Economy Strategy.

### The Activities of a Climate Innovation Center (CIC)

The CIC model is derived from a comprehensive analysis of similar efforts and in-depth application in a number of key countries. The CIC offers a suite of services including financing, access to information, business advisory & training, government advisory and other services specifically designed to address barriers and gaps that prevent a country from succeeding in the clean technology revolution.



### Developing a CIC for Gauteng and South Africa

The CIC model is now being customized to fit the conditions of Gauteng and South Africa. This in-depth stakeholder-led process will tailor the CIC model to fit and leverage South Africa's strengths, priorities and address its challenges.

- High level of technical sophistication
- Strong renewable resources (e.g., solar)
- Pressing need for employment
- Potential as hub for Africa
- Challenge of "dual economy"
- Acute vulnerability to climate change
- High government awareness of "green economy"

A full business plan for a Gauteng CIC will be available for implementation by the end of the year.



# A Global Network of CICs

The Gauteng CIC will become part of a growing global network of CICs and will anchor South Africa's climate innovation activities. *infoDev's* Climate Technology Program plans to create a network linking 30 CICs in countries around the world. This network will allow CICs and the companies they support fully participate in the globalized clean and climate technology sector.



### Activities of a global network of CICs

- International business-to-business (B2B) connections
- Vehicle for efficient global grant and investment financing
- Knowledge and information platforms to share global best practice
- Demand aggregation
- Accelerated technology transfer
- Joint research projects
- Export/import market facilitation
- Regional and global events

The first CIC is to be launched in Kenya with a budget of US\$15m with others currently being developed in India, Morocco, Vietnam, Ethiopia and elsewhere. More information on *infoDev's* Climate Technology Program can be found at: <http://www.infodev.org/climate>.

CICs at the national level, as well as the global CIC network, will complement the Technology Mechanism being developed under the UNFCCC, including the planned Climate Technology Center and Network (CTC&N).
